Improving compliance with the IDSA guidelines in the management of community acquired pneumonia (in an outpatient setting)

The IDSA (Infectious Disease Society of America) published guidelines for the management of community acquired pneumonia (CAP) in 2011. Despite these guidelines, narrow spectrum antibiotics are not routinely first line treatment, there is overutilization of macrolids in patient's less than 6 months of age and CXRs are repeated routinely at the end of therapy.

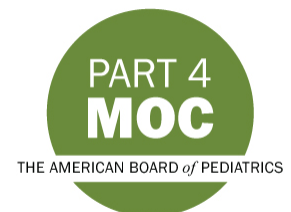
